# Uniform

- ▶ The colour scheme is bottle green and grey.
- ▶ Green sweatshirt with school logo; it is an expectation that every pupil will have at least one sweatshirt showing the school logo to wear during most of the week, but to keep costs down for parents/carers plain bottle green sweatshirts will also be accepted
- ▶ White t-shirt, preferably showing the school logo, or white shirt
- ▶ Grey trousers, skirts or pinafores
- ▶ Socks can be white, bottle green or grey; tights must also be in line with school colour scheme of bottle green or grey
- ▶ All clothing needs to be labelled.
- ▶ Black shoes, no jewellery (small plain stud earrings)
- ▶ All pupils must bring a coat into school
- ▶ Appropriate haircuts and accessories

# The Year 3 Curriculum

- ▶ There is an increased challenge in the work for Year 3, particularly in Maths and English.
- ▶ We will be starting with a new history topic in Y3 - 'Stone Age to the Iron Age'.

We will keep you updated on all of Year 3's history and geography units through our half termly curriculum news.

- ▶ Homework will be set once a week for Year 3 pupils. Alongside this children will be asked to read every night, these could be books from home, school reading books or a magazine/ newspaper etc. Remember, we have a school target of every child reading at least 3 times a week!
- ▶ Homework will consist of spellings, reading, maths and the Big Write.
- ▶ Children will also get extra homework throughout the week which is called 'Raffle Ticket Homework'. This is to consolidate learning daily and children are awarded raffle tickets for each piece they complete and hand in.

- ▶ Pupils in Year 3 are expected to know the following times tables and division facts:

$2x$ ,  $3x$ ,  $4x$ ,  $5x$ ,  $8x$ ,  $10x$ .

Support and extra homework will be given to those pupils who are struggling to recall all of their times tables.

- ▶ Half termly spellings will be sent home for pupils to learn, understand and use within their work.
- ▶ Pupils will receive daily marking and feedback for their class work. They will also complete regular assessments to help find any gaps in learning, these gaps will then be targeted within class work.
- ▶ Phonics is a big focus in Year 3 to support children in their decoding and spelling. It's imperative children practice their spellings and reading daily to ensure the best chances of success.
- ▶ Library books will be changed every Wednesday
- ▶ Reading books will be changed every Friday.
