Dear Parents/ Carers,

It has felt very autumnal here at Cheetwood this week with lots of beautiful coloured leaves falling from the trees. Children in the Early Years have been learning all about Autumn: animals hibernating; changes in colours and printing autumn pictures using fruit and vegetables.

Just before half term, we introduced a whole school Reading approach for children in Years 2 – 6, called VIPERS. VIPERS is an acronym to aid the recall of the 6 reading domains as part of the UK's reading curriculum. They are the key areas which we feel children need to know and understand in order to improve their comprehension of texts. When reading with your child at home, please do ask about the VIPERS approach.

Vocabulary - Find and explain meaning of words in context.

Inference - Make and justify inferences using evidence from the text.

Prediction - Predict what might happen from the details given and implied.

Explanation - Explain how content is related, how meaning is enhanced through choice of language, themes and patterns and how information contributes to the overall experience.

Retrieval - Retrieve and record information and identify key details.

Summary - Sequence the key events in the text.

Following feedback from our weekly coffee mornings, Mrs Gregory, Miss Dunn and myself have been busy researching a range of online platforms and apps to support our communication with parents. This would allow the school to send communication electronically, as well as have a secure space where parents can view information. No more hunting in the book bags for a letter or missing out on important communication. We will keep you updated in the coming weeks as to which supplier we have chosen and how we will support parents with the implementation of the process.

I hope you all have a lovely weekend. If you are attending any firework shows, please do keep safe.
