UNICEF Rights Respecting School



- Rights Respecting Team Miss Jamil, Miss Fisher & Miss Rogerson.
- Unicef is the world's leading organisation working for children and young people and their rights. In 1989, governments across the world agreed that all children have the same rights by adopting the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC). These rights are based on what a child needs to survive, grow, participate and fulfil their potential.
- Cheetwood became a Bronze UNICEF Rights Respecting School in March 2023.
- Manchester aims to be the first child friendly city in the world
- Parents and carers will receive a survey in the coming week regarding this, we want to capture your thoughts on this school initiative.
- ► Each class has been tasked with looking at the UNCRC to decide on their class charter this will enable adults and pupils to work together to achieve the best!

Uniform

- The colour scheme is bottle green and grey.
- ▶ Green sweatshirt with school logo; it is an expectation that every pupil will have at least one sweatshirt showing the school logo to wear during most of the week, but to keep costs down for parents/carers plain bottle green sweatshirts will also be accepted
- White t-shirt, preferably showing the school logo, or white shirt
- Grey trousers, skirts or pinafores
- Socks can be white, bottle green or grey; tights must also be in line with school colour scheme of bottle green or grey
- All clothing needs to be labelled.
- Black shoes, no jewellery (small plain stud earrings)
- All pupils must bring a coat into school
- Appropriate haircuts and accessories

The Year 1 curriculum

- There is an **increased challenge** in the work for Year 1, particularly in Maths and English.
- We will be focusing on **phonics**, **place value** and **number recognition**. We will also be focusing on **handwriting** and **letter formation**. The children will have daily handwriting practice and dedicated **fine motor sessions** (including continuous provision) to help develop their skills in this area.
- Pupils will be expected to learn their 2s,5s and 10 times tables by the end of year 1 and recognise number bonds to 20 fluently (addition and subtraction facts)
- In literacy pupils are expected to be able to read and spell year 1 common exception words/100 High Frequency words (aka **tricky words**).
- Reading books will be changed every Thursday and pupils will also have the opportunity to take home a library book.
- To help the children with the transition from the Early Years Foundation Stage to Key Stage 1 there will be lots of opportunity for active learning and learning through play. This will be alongside whole class and focus group teaching.

- ▶ Please use the **Reading Record** to communicate with staff and sign when your child reads at least 3X a week or more!
- Spellings will be sent home for pupils to learn, understand and use within their work.
- Pupils will receive daily marking and feedback for their class work. They will also complete regular assessments to help find any gaps in learning, these gaps will then be targeted within class work.
- Phonics is a big focus in Year 1 and the children will undergo the phonics screening check in June. This is a national assessment that all year 1 pupils complete during the same week. We will send out more information regarding this nearer the time.
