- Unicef is the world's leading organisation working for children and young people and their rights. In 1989, governments across the world agreed that all children have the same rights by adopting the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC). These rights are based on what a child needs to survive, grow, participate and fulfil their potential.
- Cheetwood became a Bronze UNICEF Rights Respecting School in March 2023.
- Manchester aims to be the first child friendly city in the world
- Parents and carers will receive a survey in the coming week regarding this, we want to capture your thoughts on this school initiative.
- ► Each class has been tasked with looking at the UNCRC to decide on their class charter this will enable adults and pupils to work together to achieve the best!

Uniform

- ▶ The colour scheme is bottle green and grey.
- Green sweatshirt with school logo; it is an expectation that every pupil will have at least one sweatshirt showing the school logo to wear during most of the week, but to keep costs down for parents/carers plain bottle green sweatshirts will also be accepted
- White t-shirt, preferably showing the school logo, or white shirt
- Grey trousers, skirts or pinafores
- Socks can be white, bottle green or grey; tights must also be in line with school colour scheme of bottle green or grey
- All clothing needs to be labelled.
- Black shoes, no jewellery (small plain stud earrings)
- All pupils must bring a coat into school
- Appropriate haircuts and accessories

The Year 5 Curriculum

- ▶ There is an increased challenge in the work for Year 5 , particularly in Maths and English.
- We will be starting with a new history topic in Year 5 -'Vikings vs Anglo Saxons'.

We will keep you updated on all of Year 5's history and geography units through our half termly curriculum news.

- ▶ Homework will be set three times a week for Year 5 pupils. Alongside this children will be asked to read every night, these could be books from home, school reading books or a magazine/ newspaper etc. Remember, we have a school target of every child reading at least 3 times a week!
- Homework will consist of spellings, reading, maths and planning and researching/drafting pieces of writing.
- Children are encouraged to do 'extra homework' in areas they have studied in class or in subjects they are interested in. Pupils will be given house points for these pieces.
- Library books will be changed every Wednesday
- Reading books will be changed weekly on a Friday.

Pupils in Year 5 are expected to know all the times tables and division facts for times tables up to 12x

Support and extra homework will be given to those pupils who are struggling to recall all of their times tables.

- ▶ Half termly spellings will be sent home for pupils to learn, understand and use within their work.
- Pupils will receive daily marking and feedback for their class work. They will also complete regular assessments to help find any gaps in learning, these gaps will then be targeted within class work.
