Year 1 Curriculum News Autumn Term 2 2023

This half term in Year 1 your child will be learning the following: English: The Tiger who came to Tea by Judith Kerr

- Reading and writing captions
- Reading and writing stories relevant to texts we have discussed
- Using chronological vocabulary to describe life events, e.g., before, after that, now, then
- Choosing appropriate words to complete sentences
- Focusing on early writing skills finger spaces, capital letters, full stops and reading their sentences to check they make sense.

To help your child to improve their reading, encourage them to read at least three times a week and get their reading record signed each time.

Mathematics

<u>Shape</u>

- Recognise and name 3-D shapes
- Sort 3-D shapes
- Recognise and name 3-D shapes
- Sort 2-D shapes
- Patterns with 2-D and 3-D shapes

Consolidation of previous learning

- Count to and across 10 forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number
- Sort, count and represent objects
- Count, read and write numbers to 10 in numerals
- Given a number, identify one more and one less
- Identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations including the number
- line, and use the language of: equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most, least
- Read and write numbers from 1 to 10 in numerals and words

Number - addition & subtraction (within 10)

- Using part-whole models
- Read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+)

subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs

- Represent and use number bonds/fact families and related addition/subtraction facts within 10
- Add and subtract one-digit and two-digit numbers to 10, including zero
- Solve one-step problems that involve addition and subtraction, using concrete objects and pictorial representations, and missing number problems such as 7 = ? 9.

Helping your child at home

- Encourage them to write labels for things in the home –e.g. table, chair, bed
- Help them to write captions for family photos e.g. This is my brother and my uncle.
- Order and write numbers to 100
- Read books about places you visit often e.g. the park, the shops
- Practise the termly spellings and common exception words
- Please take time to read with your child every night and make a note in their reading diaries

Geography:

Where do I live? Learning objectives:

- To be able to name the seven continents of the world and locate the UK on a world map.
- To be able to identify the countries and capital cities of the UK.
- To be able to identify features and characteristics of the countries of the UK.
- To explore the town we live in.
- To be able to describe where you live.

Science:

Identifying plants:

- To find out what a plant is
- To identify and describe garden plants
- To identify and describe wild plants
- To identify and describe a range of trees
- To identify the parts of a plant
- To make observations of growing plants

Design and Technology: Mechanisms - making a moving story book.

These are the key skills we are going to focus on:

- Explaining how to adapt mechanisms, using bridges or guides to control the movement.
- Designing a moving story book for a given audience.
- Following a design to create moving models that use levers and sliders.
- Testing a finished product, seeing whether it moves as planned and if not, explaining why and how it can be fixed.
- Reviewing the success of a product by testing it with its intended audience.

RE: Who is a Christian and what do they believe?

This unit enables pupils to begin to understand what Christians believe about God and about Jesus. This unit looks at stories about Jesus and stories that Jesus told.

Programming 1: All about instructions
