## Important information:

\***Friday 2nd February is NSPCC Number Day.** Children are encouraged to come to school dressed up as a number, you can do as much or as little as you wish. Last year was a roaring success. \* **Road safety** - Please be mindful when crossing the road and getting in and out of cars at drop off and pick up times. Over the last few weeks we have seen an increased number of dangerous situations that could have resulted in injury for a child/ parent. **Please encourage your child/ren to make safe choices when crossing the road:**

- Cross at the traffic lights
- Use the green cross code: Look left, right and left again. Listen for traffic before crossing
- Never cross from behind a car, van, bus - children may not be seen by oncoming traffic
- Hold an adults hand when crossing
- Ensure children exit the car onto the pavement not the middle of the road
- Where possible, walk to school

Mrs Clark has made contact with Manchester City Council and requested support with Road Safety on the surrounding roads. Our Rights Respecting School Council will also be out and about surveying road safety over the coming half term. Thank you for your support.
