Theme: How do things grow and change?

This half term children will explore the natural environment around them. They will plant seeds, beans and flowers, and learn how to care for them. They will make observations of plants and explore how they change over time. As we approach Easter we will learn about how Easter is celebrated and share books such as We're going on an Egg hunt and The Very Hungry Caterpillar's Easter Egg Hunt.
