### Theme: Who lives outdoors and where can we find them?

Children will explore the homes of minibeasts, animals and prehistoric animals. Children will find out about different habitats commenting on the differences they can see. Children will work practically to explore how to create homes for animals within our outdoor area thinking carefully about different materials and animals needs.
